Dedicated teachers inspire pupils

to pursue the very highest academic standards. During the first three years, pupils follow a broad academic curriculum, which includes all three sciences, Latin and two foreign languages chosen from French, German, Spanish and Italian. IT is taught as an integral part of the curriculum. Support is available for girls who need help with learning strategies.

At GCSE, all students follow a core curriculum in addition to a wide range of optional subjects such as Classical Greek. Girls have a choice of more than twenty subjects at A level, including History of Art, Politics, Psychology, RS and Theatre Studies.

The opportunity to participate in creative arts

is offered to every pupil. Music, Art and Drama flourish at Francis Holland with a great emphasis placed on the girls' musical development. The school has many orchestras, choirs, bands and ensembles. Most pupils play at least one instrument and in the spring term we stage our annual choral concert with Harrow School. In recent years our musicians and choristers have enjoyed trips to Prague, St Petersburg, Venice, Boston and Krakow.





Art is popular

and is taught in modern, well-equipped studios. Many different ideas and approaches are encouraged and aspects as diverse as life drawing, painting, ceramics, creative embroidery, fabric-printing and print-making are offered. Art is studied by all girls in their first three years and by many pupils at GCSE and A level.











Drama is taught as part of the English syllabus

with many girls taking Speech and Drama as an extra subject and Theatre Studies at A level. Participation is actively encouraged at every stage of a production and in addition to the school plays, there is an annual form drama competition and pupils also write, direct and perform plays of their own.







Encouraging team spirit

through participation in sport is central to life at Francis Holland and Physical Education remains at the heart of the curriculum. As well as having Central London's largest outdoor sports facility in Regent's Park on our doorstep, we have our own indoor swimming pool and gymnasium. We offer an enormous range of activities such as netball, hockey, tennis, rounders, water-polo, swimming, gymnastics, volleyball and yoga.

Regular sporting tours are undertaken with our netball and hockey teams having recently enjoyed successful tours to South Africa and Sri Lanka and our swimming teams have competed in Malta, Cyprus and Mallorca.

In addition, senior girls have the opportunity to choose activities as diverse as canoeing, golf, scuba-diving, fencing and modern dance.









The sixth form is an exciting time


